SENATOR HARTNETT: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: To me, I probably will never, ever ask to carry a concealed weapon, and I'm in the retail business, you know. I would imagine that possibly I could get one now because of carrying sometimes a lot of money to the bank and back. I would have, I guess, an excuse to carry one. I don't believe I have to. But that's my opinion. I don't want to carry one. But that doesn't mean my neighbor might want to. So if he has a concern, or she has a concern, for heaven's sakes, let them get a permit. You're not going to see that...I would image Nebraska would be about probably a half percent of the population in the state would apply for a permit. And that, to me, isn't very many people. Those people that shouldn't have them have them now.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: This lets...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Time, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And, Senator Combs.

SENATOR COMBS: (Microphone malfunction)...the body. I would like to take this opportunity to show you right now a lethal weapon. Here it is, folks. People have been killed with these. I could take it right now and jam it between somebody's ribs and puncture your pericardium and bust your heart. (Laugh) I could do that. I have a lethal weapon, and right now it's concealed. Okay. I made my point. What I would like to tell you is that if you've been the victim of crime you can have a little bit better more of an understanding for those of us who do support this as being one of the reasons. I'd like to reply also to Senator Schimek's constituent. She would be very surprised to know how many people are actually around her in the mall, out in town, and in the movie theater who are armed, and it's concealed, and it's illegal. They're around us everywhere. We just don't see it because it's concealed. And I think it's a
