which we haven't gotten to yet. And I'm not going to hasten to get to them, even if you all vote for cloture. Because I'll have the opportunity to show the defects in the bill. And the question could be, why the rush? But at any rate, to go to another area, in Section 12, on page 10, we're talking about the places which are off limits for carrying one of these concealed weapons. I would like to include a day-care facility. A person should not be able to go armed onto the premises of a day-care facility. I think premises or places where gambling occurs, there definitely should not be an allowance to carry these concealed weapons. And although Senator Mines mentioned it this morning, I had looked at that also in terms of a theater. You should not be able to carry one of these in a theater, and in my way of thinking, any other place of entertainment. You have all types of people, including children, who come to these places of entertainment. Families wind up there. And there is no need for anybody to go to a place such as that with a pistol. I also think there should be a blanket provision that would exempt premises where minors customarily are or may be expected to be present. I could not think of every place that a minor might be on the premises. So some general language like that ought to be in the bill. I would like to ask Senator Tyson a question, because I see he's back in his seat.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Tyson, would you yield to a question from Senator Chambers?

SENATOR TYSON: If it is an easy question.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson, on page 11...and I'll give you a chance to get there. And would you let me know when you're there?

SENATOR TYSON: That's...Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR TYSON: That's just two ones?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Side by side.
