SENATOR TYSON:    Side by side?

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Yeah, two digits.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    When we're talking about a place that holds a liquor license, there is language that says, that...quote, that derives over one-half of its total income from the sale of alcoholic liquor.

SENATOR TYSON:    Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Suppose that language were stricken, and it would just say that anybody who holds a liquor license...any place that holds a liquor license is a place where concealed guns will not be allowed.

SENATOR TYSON:    And the question is?

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Suppose that were to...this language would be stricken, so that that would be what's left.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    That in no place where a liquor license is allowed will concealed weapons be permitted on the premises

SENATOR TYSON:    Okay. The reason that the language is as it is, is that a good many restaurants, they may only serve beer or wine, but they have a beverage license. And it is not the
