SENATOR CHAMBERS:    No, evidence.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    I'm just thinking off the top of my head.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    This isn't the information. Because there's a part that talks about false information. Then it goes on to add to that,...

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    Or false evidence.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    ...or false evidence.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    And I'm wondering what the evidence is, as distinguished from information.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    Well, for instance, it would be...now, give me a minute...

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Sure.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    ...to come up with this, will you? It would be false evidence if you came in...yeah, probably...maybe a wig would be. If you have black hair and you come in with a wig that indicates your hair is red and you take the wig off and throw it away after you leave and never thereafter portrayed yourself as having red hair, that probably would be false...and did it with the intent that it be misleading as to your identity, that probably would be false evidence.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    And based on what you said...that's what I'm looking at.
