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SENATOR RAIKES: Well, let me ask you this way. Is the purpose of this, in the surrounding discussion, if you will, for you to get reaction from the Legislature on...am I on the right track here? Is this the direction we should go?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I strongly feel this is the direction that we should go.

SENATOR RAIKES: So you're really not asking that question. You're...I'm trying to get a feel...are there some specific points in here, or some statements, that are potentially controversial that someone would say, no,...and I ask this out of ignorance of the area as much as anything...no, that's the wrong direction? I haven't heard anybody say that.

SENATOR JENSEN: Right. And perhaps next year when the bill is presented there will be some objection. And we'll do that then just like any other bill. We'll discuss that and we'll work through those areas. I certainly hope that through the involvement of the county officials, through the stakeholders, that we can come to as much consensus as possible. Certainly there's going to be some people that I would imagine will be in opposition, once we get everything pinned down. But this points us towards a direction to go, and says...

SENATOR RAIKES: This is, in a sense, you might argue, an interim study without the study. I mean, you've sort of made...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...made the point that...

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, and we have had enough studies. I think it's time to set a direction to go.

SENATOR RAIKES: So in a phrase, if "interim study" or "study" is not the right description, what would be a good description?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I would say, to develop and start an implementation phase of this direction, to implement this
