owner, and his partner, because just the cost. The cost was about \$27,000 a year. And the only reason that that was that cheap is that they have a good insurance policy besides that, which is about a \$500 deductible. Another thing that kept the rate down was that in the years of their existence, which I think has been 12 to 15 years, they'd only had one claim against it, and that was three years ago when somebody hurt a knee and was out of...was not able to work for about six months. But they said the cost is getting to where it's almost prohibitive to keep operating. And I hear this many, many times. And I really think of the whole aspect of more regulations and things like that, there are things that we do have to have. But it seems like we make so many laws that really address a small percentage of bad actors or something like that, that put such a burden on so many. Anybody I know, and myself, we carry health insurance, we carry liability, we carry an umbrella that would cover anything on top of that, try to cover all this. But Senator Beutler, I guess I'd like to ask you a couple questions of some comments you made earlier, so.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you respond, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR KREMER: You had mentioned, like, yesterday, I think, 68,000 farm workers. Do you know how that broke down at all, or not? Are they...would they be covering, like, custom combiners, or something like Senator Bromm was talking about, or...it seems like it's kind of a high number. I'm not sure whether it's migrant workers that would be maybe working in the sugar beet fields, or something like that, or...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah. Senator, the federal statistics that I was looking at talked about hired farm laborers, and indicated that there were 68,000 of them. But on further research last night, I think that of those 68,000, probably only 15 to 20 thousand of them are what you and I would call a hired...

SENATOR KREMER: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...person. The rest of them are proprietors,
