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has recently become a problem or it probably would have been a bill if it had been anticipated that this was going to develop in this manner. I would wonder if I could ask Senator Connealy a question or two.

SENATOR CUDABACK:     Would you respond, Senator Connealy, to a question from Senator Bromm?

SENATOR CONNEALY:     Yes.

SPEAKER BROMM:        Senator Connealy, hearing some of the objections of some of our colleagues, I would wonder whether you would consider, rather than taking this to a vote at this point in time, perhaps consider withdrawing the amendment. I know there are a couple of other vehicles out there that might come up a little bit later in the session, or this bill, if it does advance, will come back hopefully on Select File. If it doesn't advance it wouldn't do any good to attach your amendment anyway. So I wonder whether you would consider that, one of those avenues, which could afford maybe an opportunity for you and Senator Vrtiska and others to more fully explore the issue, and anyone that's interested, for that matter, and I just wonder whether you would consider that approach.

SENATOR CONNEALY:     Yes, Senator Bromm, I would, because I do know that this is a stretch, that this is beyond what we normally do, but I would do it only under everyone's understanding that this is coming back; that this will be refiled on Select or on some other bill because of the fact that I think that we need to address this now, that we need to have a solution, this or some other solution, to make sure that this program, these inspections don't arbitrarily stop. And so I would be open to that and...but I want everybody to know that I'm serious in trying to maintain this program.

SPEAKER BROMM:        I understand that. Mr. President, I would yield the rest of my time to Senator Connealy, if he'd like it.

SENATOR CUDABACK:     Senator Connealy, if you'd like to use that, about two and a half minutes.
