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time, particularly representing newspapers and so forth, there was always a question as to just exactly what is a game of chance, what is a lottery. And the attempt in this legislation is to have a clarification of that issue. And then not only does it clarify the issue, to say that there can be such a proposal, but it brings it back to this body to make the determination as to what should or should not be done. The second safeguard, ...I know there's always the concern about expanding the gambling process. But there's another safeguard, and that is that the various public bodies will have a vote on those issues as to whether or not they should implement this kind of gaming process. And all of these people that we're talking about licensed-type people, your operators, your entities, all involved in this through the line, are licensed people. So this is not just wildly going after some process. But what do they do with these monies in the communities? Now, you know, we have been reducing pretty regularly the monies that go to the various political subdivisions. We reduced it by 25 percent in this last session, and they'll be reduced further in this session. Which gives them fewer dollars with which to do their ordinary functions. Now, I've got a huge book here that shows all of the things that are done by communities as a result of having keno operations. And these are all done in a form of having a regulated use. But they're done at the approval of the community. And in all the history that we've had keno operations, for example, pickle cards, whatever, the communities have voted on these things, and there has never been a situation where they've voted it out once they voted in. But by this method, we will have...the Legislature will have not only the authority to allow these sorts of processes, but also the authority to regulate. Now, I'm very concerned, if we have an initiative petition that doesn't leave with this body the authority to make authorizations and regulations, that it's going to be out of our control. And I think that's a bad situation. We're...otherwise, we're just carte blanche leaving to the general public the option of going forward with this without any oversight by the Legislature. This is our opportunity to have oversight. So by this process, we would have first the passing of the constitutional amendment. We would then have that come back to the Legislature for enabling legislation. And then after we make enabling legislation, we
