SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Don Pederson.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I'm sorry, I was (inaudible).

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Pederson, under your amendment, would the racetracks be able to have the casinos with our approval or without our approval, with your amendment?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Well, as far as the casinos are concerned, I don't know whether a racetrack would actually want or need a casino in connection with that. This would give them, if we authorize it in the Legislature, the opportunity to allow electronic gaming within the racetrack operation.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Now, that...would that still be with the Legislature's approval?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: We're keeping control here in the Legislature by my amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. So then we could possibly have something at the racetrack. But that would just allow us to authorize that. There would be no vote of the people in the community that that track was in?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: That's right. The track is self-operating. Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: But any other facility, except for, with Senator Bromm's amendment to your amendment we could have up to four other casinos, plus, if Dodge County...or, say the city of Fremont, the city of North Platte, voted to allow expanded gaming in their cities, then it could be all of the above
