player-activated electronic machines. And this basically means, as I understand it...and I am no authority in this area...could mean slot machines, video poker, video horse racing, anything as long as it's player-activated and played on a machine. Includes pickle cards and keno and everything. And that means that if you had them, if you allowed this, then you're basically going to have it in every community that chooses to have it. And trust me, if one community over here chooses it, the one six miles down the road sooner or later is going to choose it. I mean, it's just a matter of survival and competition. I think we're just opening this up to a lot of communities...

SENATOR VRTISKA: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that maybe initially aren't even going to want it. There aren't any limitations, as far as I can tell, on the number of racetracks that you could authorize to have this form of gaming. Which means, maybe we'd end up having more racetracks in the state. And you may think that's okay, but that's the fact of the matter. The proceeds for this apparently, at least in the case of the counties, cities, and villages, those proceeds don't really go to the state. They go for community betterment purposes. And it would be up to us to say what happens to that at the racetracks. I just have...I would like to echo, I guess, some of the sentiments that have previously been expressed. If we, at every stage of development of this bill, keep adding stuff to it, it is going to be so heavy it is going to sink of its own weight.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Time.
