Now, if you would assume that every one of those problem gamblers were in the high-risk category, pathological, if you will, that would cost each one...that would cost the state \$10,500 for each one of them, doubling the amount that we talked about earlier. So now you're up to \$436 million if nothing is done. Now, 41,000 is less than three percent, and that's supposedly what the amount is. So...I mean, come on, we're not talking about what a great idea this is. Senator Schimek talked about, we shouldn't give in to the minority on another bill. And here we are giving in to a minority on this bill. I think the overall idea is, somehow the public perceives there's a bunch of money out there that's going to help them somehow, without any consequences. They're willing to dismiss those. It's ridiculous. It's not true. Nonetheless, here we are debating this, debating this idea. And that's fine. We have a number of reports that will say whatever you want to say. At the end of the day,...

SENATOR VRTISKA: One minute.

SENATOR ERDMAN: ...we have to be able to generate revue to offset the costs. And if you're going to fall on the sword just because the people want to do that, I've got another idea. A couple of them, maybe. One, why don't we let the voters vote on whether or not we should raise taxes here in another couple of weeks? Well, that's our responsibility, right? Well, so is this. Senator Tyson pointed that out. The voters have voted. We have a representative form of government. If we disagree that this should be out there, they're going to put their own out there. And I'm not convinced that if we put one out there they're not going to do it anyways. Because as Senator Tyson said, the return on their investment if those individuals that seek to enshrine themselves in our state constitution, to be greedy and try and steal money directly from the citizens of the state, through the good guise of gambling, they're still going to try it. Because I'm not convinced they're going to get what they want out of the Legislature. So I rise to share comments, to ask questions. And who knows, Senator Stuthman. Maybe there are some answers.
