reasons not to speak on this. Everything has been said. There is nothing new to say. The die is cast, et cetera, et cetera, and here I stand speaking. I pushed my light after hearing what Senator Don Pederson had to say and what Senator Chambers had to say, two people who did not vote for this the first time around but are supporting it now. Maybe there is more movement and more fluidity than I thought at the start of the day. So I'm just going to take a minute or two and give one quick shove in favor of the resolution, and then sit down. Let me remind those who if you're a flat out no, a no all the way on this, this is the gamble that you are taking. You're gambling on two things. Number one, you're gambling that the Nebraska Supreme Court is going to strike down the petition before it right now, the petition that was derailed by a legal challenge that attracted 180,000 signatures. That's number one. The second thing that you're gambling on is that no new petition drive will result. Now your first one, that might be a pretty good bet. Perhaps that petition will be struck down. The second one, a new petition drive, I think that's almost a certainty. And I remember when people lobbied me last summer, in July, we were getting ready for the first special session we had last year, and I was hearing from people saying, we've got to broaden the call. We've got to broaden the call. We've got to include gambling. That darn petition got the signatures, it's going on the ballot. We've got to get something on there. And I had voted for the expanded gambling amendment in the regular session, but I said, no, we had our shot. That's it. If it happens, it happens. Senator Schrock is the voice I remember most clearly from last year saying on this floor, at that time, people, if we don't deliver something, have you seen that petition that's floating out there? That petition campaign is going to kick into gear and that's what we will get, if we don't assert ourselves and take some responsibility here. Well, and sure enough, that's what happened. And as I say, I was hearing from some people who had not voted or had voted no saying we need a second chance. We're ready to vote yes now. Okay, well, the petition was derailed, and we didn't do it. Well, you know how it has played out so far. But I'm saying, don't anyone pretend, oh, maybe there isn't sentiment out there in the public. Senator Chambers said it's because of paid circulators and that will make it happen. I suppose that's part of it. I
