Legislature." The petition specifically discusses where the proceeds from the gaming with the devices will go. This would provide clear contradictory language in LR 11CA to these provisions of the petition. The goal is to make LR 11CA conflict with the petition effort as clearly as possible, in case the petition and this amendment are considered on the same ballot. If that were the case and both amendments passed, then the courts would determine areas where they conflict. When they conflict, the amendment with the most votes would be enacted on that issue. Second, the amendment addresses a technical issue raised during the drafting of the previous portion of the amendment. It removes the language in (c) regarding the facilities and limiting it to "under this subsection." This language was added by Senator Beutler during General File discussion to address concerns raised that the horse racing facilities would automatically be part of the eight facilities. However, it could be read with this change that the eight include tribal gaming facilities, which are also covered under this sentence. It would read: the Legislature may authorize gaming at up to eight facilities in the State of Nebraska regardless of whether any activity authorized by this section is conducted at such facilities. This language is intended to clarify that eight facilities may include facilities that are...that conduct other types of gaming allowed under this section, such as, horse racing, but does not have to include the types of facilities. With that, the purpose of the amendment is to give direction to the courts if this was showing the conflicting sections in the petition that is being studied right now and LR 11CA. With that, I would try to answer any questions that you may have. But that is the thrust of the amendment just to show the difference between the two amendments, should they be there. Thank you.
