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all know that an initiative petition or two ballot issues on the same ballot, if they both pass, they are both enacted unless there are some competing parts of them. And I think what Senator Janssen is trying to do with this amendment is set up a scenario where as if an amendment that we put on the ballot and an amendment that a petition would put on the ballot, if they would both pass, how do we assure that the one with the most votes actually gets enacted. Am I...I'm correct in that, right, Senator Janssen? And I would just encourage the adoption of the Janssen amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Seeing no further discussion, Senator Janssen, you're recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Schimek kind of summed it up. That...this is all that this does is in case both of the proposals were to be authorized by the electorate, then the bill that...the petition or this bill, where they conflict, where they conflict in language, it would be the proposal which had the most votes. Now that is all it is in a nutshell. I ask your support for this. It's procedural and it needs to be there. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: You've heard the closing. Members, the question before us is the adoption of AM1107. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to vote? Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Bromm, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: A call of the house has been requested. All in favor...

SENATOR JANSSEN: However, I would accept call-in votes also.

SPEAKER BROMM: A call of the house has been requested. All in favor of a call of the house please vote aye, and opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
