I think that putting more into the constitution at this time would probably be more detrimental than leaving it generic the way it is right now, and I think that would be something we'd come back and address later. Thank you for the conversation, Senator Louden, and thank you,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I just wanted to reiterate that whether or not we do the gambling or not, that's beside the point, but if we do it I think in our area we can probably use this for a certain amount of economic development. It isn't like you would be getting factories and that sort of thing in the area, but I think tourism is probably going to be something that we can market out in that area a lot better than some of the other projects that have went on. One thing with tourism, it will come and go. We need transportation to go with it, so it will all work hand in hand. We've noticed what transportation does for up and down Interstate 80. Those are areas that do quite well and that works right back to the transportation and having your points of destination. And I'll return the rest of my time back to the Speaker. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Louden. There are no further lights on to discuss the proposed amendment, Senator Louden. You are recognized to close on the amendment.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This is something that would do us some... a great deal of help out in the western area if we go down this gambling amendment road. I think there's something in the future for us. We all know that we have gambling now so I think that we should do it in a business type of way; work at this so that we can get some benefits out of it rather than worry about the emotional side that some people have on it. I would urge adopting this as a way of having gambling
