districts. That standard I think, too, is in keeping with what we already have and certainly should not be difficult to do. Posting the information on their web site, again, should not be difficult, should not be expensive, and I believe is in line and in keeping with what we expect of any public body. And a public utility that has those members on their board, elected by the public, should want to keep the public informed, should invite them into the process as an educational process so they understand what is being done. That essentially is the amendment itself and my reasoning for doing it. I am concerned about starting down the road of privatization. I am also concerned about indemnifying a company that is not based in Nebraska, a company that has only been in operation for four years, a company that currently has, within that four-year span, three of the reactors that they have been responsible for under their watch has been "downlisted" one category, three of the eight that they operate. I don't judge them beyond the statement of what is on the web site of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. And so if they are better than the current operation by Nebraska Public Power District, then having three of their reactors "downlisted" to me says they too are not perfect, they too can have some problems, and maybe that shouldn't be the only decision that we look at as we try to do a better job of conducting and running the operation of this nuclear reactor of Nebraska Public Power District. I invite any responses or questions, and I would just mention that I did provide a copy this morning of this amendment. It was just finished being drafted this morning, so I did provide a copy of it to a representative of Nebraska Public Power District and have not had a chance at this point to visit with them. But certainly out of courtesy and in keeping with the way that I always operate, I do keep people informed and let them know of things that I'm intending to do. This is not intended to be...
