They could vote to build a new nuclear plant tomorrow with a simple majority. And I don't think this is a burden we want to put on our public power districts by requiring them to do a...

SENATOR HARTNETT: But I think...but to me, the circumstances is different here. You're going out and giving it to another entity, as I understand it.

SENATOR SCHROCK: They still own the...they still own the power plant, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: How many board members do they have, do you...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Eleven.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Eleven.

SENATOR SCHROCK: So it would require six...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Six votes.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...it would require six positive votes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. Yeah. Do they have these meet...open meetings, do you know?
