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say...fills out a little bit more the intent of the filing of the report by the Auditor when the State Auditor does a audit in concurrence or in conjunction with the permission of the Performance Evaluation Committee. When that report is done or if there's an issue comes up, it expands a little bit on what can be done with that report. It should then be reported to the Program Evaluation Committee and/or the Appropriations Committee or other appropriate committee. It simply clarifies the order that this report should be done so that it will be assured that it will...I'd call it the chain of command, if you will, or at least it will be done so that the appropriate...let's call it authoritative source will be reported to and proper reaction can be done by whatever appropriate committee that is. In other words, if there's something found that should be reported, it will go to the appropriate legislative committees. As you know, Program Evaluation is doing some of these, but if there's some areas in the area of education or any other appropriate committee of the Legislature, those reports will be done there and an appropriate action can be taken there before it might necessarily go to the world. And that's the reason for this amendment and it's been drafted a couple of times in order that we get it appropriate language and I think that we have it here. That's the reason for this amendment, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM PRESIDING

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Brown.
