generally accepted by government documents, and we cannot legally bind a future Legislature with standards that are not written yet. So, Senator Wehrbein, I thank you for bringing this amendment because in your clarifying language, by identifying by date and volume, we are in fact clarifying that this is the standard that is in place at this time and this would be the recognized standard. It would be appropriate in the future if the revised document is completed and approved that then we could come back and adopt that standard, but it is wholly appropriate for us to adopt the standard that is in place now, which you have mentioned in your amendment, and so I support that. I think it's very important that we're accurate in our language in the document. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I would just like to also rise in support of the amendment and say that I think that we've got some agreement between three different parties who were really quite interested in this specific aspect of the bill, and I, for one, am going to support it. I hope you will too. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Combs.

SENATOR COMBS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the body, I rise in support of Senator Wehrbein's amendment. I thank him very much for making it. It does codify what is appropriate to be used and helps solidify the bill. I would ask for everyone's support. Thank you for your support on it prior. And a major reason it was my priority bill was because it does address such an important issue, and I would ask for your continued support now as you did in the previous file. I'll give my time to Senator Wehrbein, if he'd like to have any more.
