visitation orders. The bill becomes effective January 1, 2004. There are, again, minor drafting amendments which were written to the bill that was reported out. I have incorporated them in this amendment. Michael Kerr, the Uniform Commissioner on State Laws, was here. The State Bar Association testified in favor of this. The Nebraska Domestic Violence Sexual Assault Coalition testified in favor of both of these measures, and I would ask for the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Landis. Are there any persons wishing to address the Landis amendment? I see none. Senator Landis, do you wish to close?

SENATOR LANDIS: I would ask for the adoption of these amendments and then...

SPEAKER BROMM: Excuse me. There was a light that came on before you started to speak. Senator...now has turned the light off. Go ahead, Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I'd ask for the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The question before us is the adoption of AM0897. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Landis' amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is adopted. Anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I simply want to reiterate my gratitude to Senator Friend for declaring this a priority measure. This will be, I think, a substantial step forward for the interstate domestic relations issues of child support, child custody, and domestic violence protection orders. Thank you.
