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are going to be fed, and if there's a bigger picture at all that we need to take in mind is where that market for these by-products is going to be, and it's particularly beef cattle, the ruminant, that is going to utilize this, and I think we have to take that strongly into consideration or our ethanol plants are going to be in a problem in a few years too. Because even though ethanol...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...will be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Chambers, followed by seven others.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I don't know if we ought to call this Ernie and the seven dwarfs, and I can say that because I don't know who the seven are following me. Trying to lighten the mood a little bit this morning, because I don't think I can support this bill. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, will you yield to a question?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes, I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, other than saying that the Ag Department will provide information and set up this database and so forth, what in this bill cannot be done right now?

SPEAKER BROMM: Well,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You don't have to answer right now, but think about it...
