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experience of some property being sold close to where my residence is. Several miles away, this property was bought by a person that does own a large farrowing unit. Because he bought this property, he had intentions of building a finishing unit on this property. And the individual that was farming the ground could work in the facility, generate \$10,000 of extra personal income, and utilize the manure from this facility. When it came to the point where a neighbor decided that wouldn't be very good to have that built close to his residence, he put up a big stink about it. And this individual that did farm the ground and was going to utilize and work and put labor into this facility and generate some income, the individual neighbor says, well, if you're going to do this, you won't be able to farm the section of ground that you farm from me. So this individual had to make the decision, you know, does he want to earn another \$10,000, or does he want to lose some crop ground. So he made the decision that he did not want to participate in this. So it goes a lot further than just hog buildings, livestock, or anything like this. It really has an impact on individual grain farmers also. One of our area towns, if livestock wasn't expanded or wasn't kept at at least the same level, or if this individual would decide to quit, the town...one-third of the population in that town works for this individual. So in that...this is a town of probably 250 to 300 people. So that really would have an impact there. I think with this bill, my understanding, and hopefully I'm right, is it really does not take anything away from the planning and zoning commission, county boards. But it does make them make a decision upon the facts that they have, not upon emotions. And that is what happens most generally. Serving as a county board of supervisors chairman past several years, we did have the instance where one individual, a pork producer, wanted to conveniently expand. And neighbors got together and they came to the board and they says, how can we stop him, how can we stop him? Well, I says, there's really nothing you can do to stop him. But I says, are you against the livestock? No, we're not against the livestock. We are against this individual getting too big. Well, I says, then I think we better adopt a resolution that we go out and arrest this person and put him in the prison, if you're not wanting that person around. They said, no, no, we don't want to do that. But that's what it comes to a lot of times. They're after individuals and not
