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could even.. and I wrote down a few things here. The approval, final approval, they'll say, we will approve your permit if you do these things. It could have to do with size, location, livestock waste management not be applied right, maybe not having an easement on some places where you could apply your waste. So there's a lot of things that you could.. but is not only approval. It could all give you the final determination that they're going to deny it if you don't do these things.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR KREMER: And the whole reason for that is, rather than going ahead and thinking that you might get your application approved and getting all your lagoons in place and your engineering done, that could cost like 40-50 thousand dollars, we hear, then to come back and have it denied, where it could have been told up front that, yes, if you do all these things...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Okay. So, we're running out of time, and I'm sorry.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But the answer to the question, I take it, is yes, you can put any conditions that you want...

SENATOR KREMER: Correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...into there. But once you set those conditions at the local level, you cannot back away from it, no matter what the conditions...

SENATOR KREMER: Well, if they...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...of the environmental...of the DEQ permit are. Is that a fair statement?

SENATOR KREMER: If they did not comply with those conditions that you put in there, you could back...you don't have a permit (inaudible).
