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was that come up with the factual determination, or the final determination. It was just worded in a different way, and it was put in a different section where it was more applicable. And I'd just like to talk a little bit about that. And I'd appreciate Senator Beutler's comments about the factual finding. That should help in litigation, whether it's denying or approving, and whichever way it might go. But the final determination...and I'd just like to have you listen carefully. Keep in mind that nothing in the amendment would require the county to approve a permit application. Nothing in the amendment requires counties to forego all the steps, including county planning commission review and hearings and the permit process. There's a natural protection for the counties. The county board has the discretion to deny any application on the grounds that there's not sufficient information. So I think there's plenty of protections in there. And some of the examples that I mentioned before, it might be subject to the state and the federal permits. Might be subject to the size, the location, the waste management, many things that they could put in there. And it's not only approval. It's also denial. We must remember that. Additionally, nothing precludes counties from requiring sufficient information and data to make the determination, regardless of whether DEQ application of final permit is approved or is applicable at the time. So it doesn't even depend on whether DEQ maybe approve theirs. But they could have some other subject matters in there that says it's subject to this, other than the DEQ permits. So I think it gives the counties plenty of room. And, Senator McDonald, we did have a hearing on that. And most of the committee amendments were in response to some of the concerns that people were taking a little bit different than what was really intended. I would like to...a lot of the concern came from some letters that were sent out. And I won't mention who the organizations were. They were very sincere, and I think...and very legitimately have concern about some of the mega hog operations that are coming in. And I don't think I...that any of us are very supportive of that means of livestock industry. But here's some of the information that was sent out to many people and the county commissioners. It says, it's believed that because we beat...this is...talks about Senator Bromm's bill last year...it's because we believe that we beat him so badly last
