you meet this, this, this, and this, and you get a DEQ permit, then contingent upon all of that, reasonably, you're going to have a chance. I would foresee, though, that if you would change the plan that would be implemented versus what you submitted, the county could say no, because that's a different permit, that's a different application. But I don't think it's fair, from my perspective, to make someone apply for something, give them the guidelines of what they should meet, and then at the end of the day tell them, we just don't like you, we don't whatever, without having some legitimate reason to deny them, when their original process laid out that this is what you're going to have to do to meet our obligations. If that's the case, then we don't have a fair law.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, you want one target, not a moving target.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Right. Exactly.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of AM1188 to the committee amendments to LB 754, Senator Vrtiska, followed by eight others.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I respectfully call the question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. The question before the body is, shall debate cease on AM1188 to the committee amendments? All in favor vote aye, and opposed nay. We're voting on ceasing debate on AM1188 to the committee amendments to LB 754. We're voting on ceasing debate. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.
