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that if a county wants help in gaining advice or technology that might be useful in handling an application, that the Department of Agriculture should be able to be a reservoir or a repository for resources that the county can ask where do we turn for this. They can give them some ideas. I think that's a positive thing. So with that, I'll yield the rest of my time back, Mr. President. I do support the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Raikes, on FA1261.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, Senator Bromm, if I could, I'd like to ask you a couple of questions. First, one of the things I'm going to touch on, I hope, in the questions is the...in Section 2 there is a provision to identify or designate a county as livestock friendly and my comment beside that is, so what? If you're a livestock friendly county, what do you get out of that?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, would you...

SENATOR RAIKES: Then, well, if I could, I'll go on...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Excuse me, Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...just a little bit. Then I go to page 5 and we talk about the applicant being able to get a final determination before the planning commission early in the process and my question is, as I understand it, this part now has nothing to do with livestock friendly as it is written. So it can be a livestock or any other kind of a special use permit. Might, for example, include a racetrack so that you would, if people had concerns about having a racetrack located next to them, well, this would bring those people's concerns on along with livestock. The other thing I notice in there, it says the final determination may be issued subject to such conditions as are identified by the commission, including but not limited to permits. So, for example, a county could say, yes, we'll give you a final determination maybe in the case of a livestock operation and one of the conditions would be that you get written approval of the project by everyone within a...every
