they have with...for economic development. So that if they had really pressed the opportunity they would have in livestock operations by designation as a livestock friendly county, then other economic development options would be available to them also. And, again, I think the main point in this bill of that would be that it would, I think, give counties a definite incentive to strive for the livestock friendly designation. With that, I'll stop. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator McDonald, followed by Senators Hudkins and Hartnett. Senator McDonald.

SENATOR McDONALD: Yes, Mr. President and members of the body, I mentioned before that I feel that there are a lot of counties out here that are also already livestock friendly, and just to mention a couple of the counties that I represent, Boone County being one of them, there are 47 sites of hog confinements with over 5,000 hogs in each confinement. In Greeley County, there are 12 to 15 sites with at least 10,000 to 15,000 hogs in each site, and Wolbach has 1 site with over 55,000 hogs in that particular site. Wheeler County as sites all around Bartlett, and Bartlett Foods has a site of over 20,000 hogs. So we are already friendly in our counties. Our counties are doing a wonderful job with their local zoning and I hate to do a detriment to that local zoning. And again, I would like to turn my time over to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, about one minute has elapsed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator McDonald. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, going back to some of the things that Senator Raikes was saying and tailgating on what Senator McDonald has said and what I had mentioned earlier this morning, to get this designation counties are going to have to go through some hoops established by the Department of Agriculture.
