other hand, you do not feel you have to prove your honesty, then you don't get the designation. If you don't satisfy some bureaucrat that you are a livestock friendly county, you do not get the designation. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question, if he will answer.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, would you respond to a question?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, is there an appeal procedure in here for counties that do not receive the designation?

SPEAKER BROMM: No

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this is left totally to the discretion of a bureaucrat in the Department of Agriculture.

SPEAKER BROMM: Subject to the application of the criteria, yeah, I guess.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the bureaucrat makes the determination as to whether the criteria are met.

SPEAKER BROMM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is a good example, I think, and demonstration about the NCAA that Brother Friend might understand. Senator Bromm, it doesn't really matter what we put into the law when a bureaucrat is allowed to interpret the law and apply it. Would you agree? The final decision is going to be in the hands of the bureaucrat who interprets and applies what we put into the law.

SPEAKER BROMM: But at least this bureaucrat we have some influence on and we can come back with a statute to change it if it isn't being applied fairly.
