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Unfortunately, many times when you go home, and they'll say, well, did you vote for that bill that we called you on, or whatever? And I'll say...and we will say, yes. And they'll say, you did? Why did you vote on that for? That was no good, blah blah blah. Not knowing that the bill has changed a lot. You know, it changed with amendments. It changed with committee amendments. It changes this way and that way. But the people aren't always privileged, or don't have access to that. So they don't realize what's happened. So I guess we like to stand up and make these so-called statements on the bill. But if I knew for one second, if I knew for one second that this amendment, the committee amendment, amendments or amendment, whatever, changed the bill a lot, or changed, not the bill, but changed what we're currently doing with zoning, I absolutely would not vote for it. If I knew it changed what we are currently doing with zoning, or changed the zoning laws, or rectified, or whatever, what we currently have, I wouldn't vote for it. But I don't think it does anything really. It's like many other bills on this floor. It doesn't really do a whole lot. But it might, it might; it could, it could. It just simply says, if we're friendly we're friendly, and it says that. It's kind of like if some old bachelor, not me, of course, not me, but if some old bachelor would hang a sign on his back and say, I'm available. Well, that would mean he might be available. But if he didn't hang the sign on his back, he might still be available, but he wouldn't want to advertise he was available. It's the same thing here. The same thing. We're saying we're friendly. We're just saying we're friendly, livestock friendly, or whatever term you want to use. It doesn't say we're not. And maybe you don't necessarily want to advertise. That's the way I see it. Now, maybe I'm wrong. If I'm wrong, so be it. But I don't think the bill does a whole lot. But it could do a whole lot. You know, what do we have to lose, I guess? Ask yourself, what do you have to lose by doing this? I guess many of you are saying, why am I talking? I don't really...I really don't know, other than the fact that I guess I want to be heard but maybe I'm not being heard. But believe me, it probably doesn't do the things that you think it might do. But what do you have to lose? Thank you.
