by which individuals who can't afford the vaccine can get it at no cost. And I simply wanted that information, the availability of assistance for the vaccine, to be included in that detailed information. That's all the amendment does, so that if an individual who wants an exemption, is in college, can't afford the \$70, information will be made to him or her on how to obtain this vaccination for no cost. That's the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. You've heard the opening on AM1193, offered by Senator Bourne and Senator Byars to LB 513. Open for discussion on AM1193. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Byars a few questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Byars, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Byars, I'm sure you saw the fiscal note and the comments by the university. What does on-campus student housing refer to?

SENATOR BYARS: On-campus student housing would be dormitories. I don't think it...I think the fraternity and sorority system are independent, so I'm not certain that they would be included as student housing. So it would be dormitories, Senator, in my estimation.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, don't people in those fraternity and sorority houses live in as close proximity, and maybe even closer, as those who live in the dorms?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And will they not attend classes when they leave that environment?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes.
