SENATOR BYARS: Because I...again, I feel the best way to approach this issue at this time is education. And...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There is nothing in this...

SENATOR BYARS: ...the education...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BYARS: ...the education is going to increase the number of people who are vaccinated.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There is nothing in this bill that requires education, that I see.

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, there is. The...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, tell me what that is.

SENATOR BYARS: ...the information that is to be distributed to the students is to educate the risk of the meningococcal disease, and the results of those risks.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Byars, do you think students receive an abundance of paper when they enter the university?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think they will read this? Or do you hope they'll read it?

SENATOR BYARS: I hope they'll read it, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if they read it, you feel that it will lead them to get a vaccination?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many students do you think get AIDS tests?
