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about the vaccination and the efficaciousness of the vaccination? Why could not the bill be converted to do that?

SENATOR BYARS: Senator, I think it does. I think the information that is required of the postsecondary...a postsecondary institution is to provide that information.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now let me ask you a question. If the student does not sign the waiver and refuses to get the vaccination, then what?

SENATOR BYARS: They would be turned down for enrollment at the university, at the postsecondary institution.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Where does it say that?

SENATOR BYARS: I'm going to have to find it, Senator. Senator, I'm sorry, I can't answer that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it's not meant to be a trick question. I just don't see in the bill where it says, if an enrolled person does not get this vaccination, he or she will be expelled from the school.

SENATOR BYARS: Senator,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes?

SENATOR BYARS: And I was in error. The bill does not give any direct orders to the postsecondary educational institution that they cannot enroll that individual. Those would be rules that would be adopted by the institutions themselves. I suppose, honestly, that if that institution chose at that point they could enroll the individual anyway. I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, this only deals with...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...this only deals with people who already are enrolled, not those who are desiring to be enrolled.
