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SENATOR BYARS: It mandates the postsecondary education to provide information relative to the risks of the disease to an incoming student who is going to live in campus housing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That is incorrect. But let me ask you, what do you mean by an incoming student? What do you mean by the term...

SENATOR BYARS: I mean a student who is...well, I am incorrect.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right.

SENATOR BYARS: It could be a student who has been enrolled at the university already.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I'm better aware of what your bill requires than you, at least on that point. But I think we might agree that the only thing mandated is the giving of this information about the disease, the risks associated with it, and the fact that an effective vaccine exists. That is the only thing mandated in the bill.

SENATOR BYARS: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why then can't we let the bill say only that, and it would accomplish your purpose, without adding this about the apparent mandating of a vaccination?

SENATOR BYARS: Senator, I don't think we disagree. I think probably we're attempting to do the same thing. I feel confident that you feel as I do. You certainly want to do everything you can to protect all of the individuals in the state, including incoming or college students. I'm not sure exactly what language, at this point, that should take. I would pledge to you to work to revise that to your satisfaction before we heard this bill on Select File.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Byars, the language is already in the bill. We don't have to work it out. I'm satisfied with the language in the bill that relates to the information. And I'm
