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SENATOR CHAMBERS:      I had told you that I would oppose a bill that would mandate these vaccinations for people in student housing. First of all...and Senator Friend might like this argument...my bill, Senator Friend, talking about a stipend, was expanded by an amendment to embrace all of the athletes, all of them. This bill continues to be restricted to only those students in student housing. We have separated them out,...

SENATOR CUDABACK:      One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      ...even though there has been no compelling reason for doing so. Senator Byars, if you know, how long has there been student housing on the campus of UNL? And I won't talk about the other postsecondary educational institutions.

SENATOR BYARS:      Not being quite as mature as you, Senator, you would probably remember that more than I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Now, "mature" could relate to age. And I am the oldest one on the floor, so I accept that. But here's what I want to know from you. Has there been student housing, in your opinion, for a considerable number of years?

SENATOR BYARS:      Yes, Senator, there has been, to the best of my knowledge.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      And we don't have...we haven't had a meningitis outbreak. So this came to you because somebody at the University of Nebraska Medical Center brought you the bill. Is that true?

SENATOR BYARS:      Brought me the idea.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      And if she had not brought this to you, we would not have this bill before...

SENATOR CUDABACK:      Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      ...us this session, would we?
