institutions. And I think that our statistics tell us that that's too late. We need to inform our high school students of this danger. And so this amendment would just say that if we're going to approve the Chambers amendment, that we would insert, after the word "Every" in line 1, "secondary and." So both your secondary and postsecondary institutions would inform parents and students. If we want to make this an education piece, let's make sure that we are informing all of the people, our students who are at risk, and let them know that this vaccine is available, and provide them with the means of education of protecting their children. I believe that it would be important that, if we're going to address it, that we address all of the populations who are at risk. So the decision is yours as to whether you're going to pass the Chambers amendment. But I would suggest to you that our historical data here in Nebraska says that if we're going to do it, we need to do it earlier. We have students that are taking sports physicals on a yearly basis. It would be an ideal time for them to be informed of this, and to receive the immunization. So we have the means. We have certainly a lot more control over the education of our students in our high school setting. So we have a population out there, we have the means to disseminate the information. Let's take advantage of it and make sure that our population knows the risk is there and can then avail themselves of the means to minimize that risk. Thank you very much, Senator Bromm.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, Senator Redfield and Senator Price called to my attention what Senator Redfield just shared with the body. And I agree with her amendment. I would like to have this information spread, broadcast, and certainly put in the hands of those who need it, and at a point where it can do some good. The reason that I would not want to limit it only to high schools is because there are students who come to the university from places other than Nebraska high schools. So I think we should leave in the postsecondary. But we ought to put in the secondary also. At that level, it might be easier to prevail on parents to get this vaccination.
