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he's received from other people who have had relatives or loved ones who have been involved in motorcycle accidents. I just want to read two of the quotes, because I know you'll know the flavor of them. Here's one. It says: On April 10, God had other plans for our Mike (phonetic). He died of extensive head injuries sustained in the accident. He never woke up. We never said good-bye to one another. He was only 30 years old. Our two small boys could not understand where daddy was, or why he would never see, talk to, and hold them again. The second one: the sorrow in my heart, having my boyfriend taken from me. Everett (phonetic) was a kind, loving, gentle man, who was well liked by everyone lucky enough to have known him. The mental anguish his parents have had to encounter will never be measured. And I know that you have all...

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...either known of personal stories like that, or read of personal stories like that. So don't say it doesn't hurt anyone else. The accidents that...and the injuries that result from riding without helmets do hurt other people. I'm going to turn my light back on, because I don't think that I'm going to have time to ask the questions of Senator Baker that I would like to ask concerning the committee amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.
