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motorcycle's fault. It was because of the automobile or the vehicle did not see them. This is a simple amendment; does not take much talk. You're either for it or you're against it. But when we have a terrible shortage of organs in our donor banks, this would be one way that maybe we could bring in a few more. Because with head injuries, there are still a lot of other organs that are usable. And I see that it would be a simple thing to do and I would ask you to support it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Pedersen. You've heard the opening on amendment AM0789 to the committee amendment. Open for discussion on that amendment. Senator Schimek, followed by Senator Raikes and eight others.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you. Mr. President and members, I am rising really to ask a few questions about the underlying amendment, but want to say that I appreciate what Senator Pedersen is trying to do, but I don't know that I'm going to vote for it. I'm going to listen, Senator Pedersen, at this point. I like the idea of being able to have more donor organs available, but maybe we should just do that for everybody who drives out on the highway. And I don't think we'd get away with that, so I don't know if I'm going to support this or not. I'll listen. But I would like to ask Senator Baker, if he is on the floor anywhere...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Is Senator Baker available? I do not see him, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Maybe I could ask Senator Smith then.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, would you yield to a question from Senator Schimek?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Smith, do you have a copy of the amendment nearby? Because...

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.
