SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...that's what I want to ask you about, if you wouldn't mind. And this is not to harass the bill or anything. I just don't...simply don't understand.

SENATOR SMITH: You wouldn't want to do that, would you?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, no.

SENATOR SMITH: (Laugh) Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I simply don't understand the amendment, and it's on...really on page 16 and 17, and it talks about what exempts you from the helmet law. And what I don't understand is down on, it starts on line 21, where it says: carries proof of successful completion of, prior to January 1, 2005, a motorcycle safety course under the Motorcycle Safety Education Act and, (ii), on or after January 1, 2005, a motorcycle safety course under the Motorcycle Safety and Training Act. Could you tell me what distinguishes those two? I don't remember, I guess, what the Motorcycle Safety Education Act requires, and how is the Motorcycle Safety and Training Act different from that? Can you answer that for me?

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. A lot of this has to do with some circular references and so forth in terms of implementation. It's been difficult to take all of these conditions and apply it in a forthright manner, but I believe that the bases are covered. The Motorcycle Safety Education Act is kind of the package deal here, and there was some prior legislation addressing education as well that used that same reference. So I would need to double-check to see which one that might have reference to, but you're wanting...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, why are we renaming it and under...after 2005, after January 1, 2005, and what's substantively different about the two acts?

SENATOR SMITH: We had to have a date that wasn't...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I understand that, but why...why couldn't it be before January 1, 2005, a course under the Motorcycle Safety
