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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, I did, and I suspected that something like this was going on but the follow-up question then would be this motorcycle safety course provided by a nationally recognized motor safety foundation, are all of these then...I mean if it's provided by the foundation, why do we have to collect a fee for it?

SENATOR SMITH: They are the ones who establish the standards and so that state to state there is similarity, so that we can recognize someone from out of state ultimately has...you know, they can pull that card and say I can go without a helmet because I've taken the two-day training course.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. So, essentially, we follow their standards but we offer the course through DMV?

SENATOR SMITH: Right, we recognize the course, right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh, we recognize the course. We don't provide the course.

SENATOR SMITH: It is subsidized through those fees, but it would, basically, be a private entity saying that they are qualified to teach the course and provide a...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, so it would be kind of like driver's ed, for instance,...

SENATOR SMITH: Yeah. Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...if they were collecting fees and they were paying the schools to provide the course, or something like that.

SENATOR SMITH: Right. Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President.
