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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Why wouldn't it become operative in...till 2005? There's an emergency clause on this bill.

SENATOR BAKER: It's on the back page of...or it must be on page 25. It's in one of those subsections or original section and I can't tell you. It's just...my answer was it's not effective and Senator Smith might be better able to answer that. I haven't been able to participate in all the debate this morning. I'm trying to get some answers handed to me, but it's in...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, yes, please do, because it does say that this has...I mean, there is an E clause on this bill and I'm assuming that the other section doesn't take effect...well, I don't know about that.

SENATOR BAKER: Oh, here's the answer. I'm sorry.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: In Section 22, on page 25, there's two effective dates here. One of them, in Section 22, does not become operative until January 1 of 2005, and that's what that section on page 17 refers to. And if you read on there, it says the rest of this act shall be...the other sections of this act shall become operative on the effective date. That's the E clause part of it. So there's a section of this committee amendment that does not become effective until January 1, 2005. The rest of it does have the E clause on it.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, and what page did you find that on, 22 did you...

SENATOR BAKER: Twenty-five,...

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SENATOR BAKER: ...Section 22.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.
