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cannot vote for this bill. And I would be willing to give my time to Senator Byars, if he would like to continue with his testimony. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Byars. Thank you, Senator Price. You have 1 minute and 50 seconds.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Thank you, Senator Price. Appreciate that. What I had started to say and I think Senator Smith picked up on it fairly quickly is that I have considered putting up a bracket motion to invite all of the senators to visit and the only place that I visited and I have familiarization with and that's the Madonna Rehab unit here in Lincoln. And their traumatic brain injury unit and their rehab classes I think would be very, very good time spent for every single one of us to see the effects of traumatic brain injury. Some of us have had those exposures before and some of us have not, but I've always found personal, real stories, when we're dealing with these type of circumstances, to be those that most impact me.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Senator. I agree with Senator Smith. So many times, the statistics that we quote, we do have to rely on outside organizations who have compiled evidence, who have conducted studies to be able to put this information together. But I obviously am not going... I promised Senator Smith I would not, on purpose, delay a vote on this bill. I certainly am not going to put up a bracket motion to visit Madonna, but I'm certain I could arrange for anybody that would choose to see the effect of traumatic brain injury, that I could arrange a tour for you and visiting with people who truly have been affected by traumatic brain injury. And I thank you, Senator Price, for yielding your time.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Byars. Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Bromm and members. I'd yield my time to Senator Smith.
