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trouble dealing with these two sections, which are very confusing, Senator Beutler, and in the course of it discovered that the education clause, if you will, that I thought was going to do so much good, was really not going to apply to that many people. It was going to be a very... a relatively few number of people that it would apply to. And, you know, I think if you've been driving 10 or 20 years, have a driver's license for driving a motor vehicle, you ought to have to take an education class or be tested every so often, and we're getting further and further away from that. But I think it's particularly valuable on a motorcycle. So if I understand you right, we're just going to make this applicable to everybody. And I guess I would like to ask just one question, if I might, Senator Beutler, about your amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Beutler, I'm assuming, from the way this reads now, that the person would only have to take the education class once in his or her whole career of riding a motorcycle. Is that correct?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I believe that's correct, from my reading of the bill, but I don't pretend to have read it as carefully as Senator Smith would. But what my amendment doesn't change the number of times the bill currently requires you to take the test.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Exactly. It just...

SENATOR BEUTLER: It simply applies it to everybody,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Everybody. Okay, I think that's...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...whatever that requirement is.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...right. And I think I will ask Senator Baker, if he wouldn't mind. Senator Baker, I think that Senator Beutler and I are understanding this right, but according to
