SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. You've heard the opening on AM1220 to the committee amendments. Open for discussion on that amendment offered by Senator Schimek. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Very briefly, I do want to point out that I have a handout and this suggests the extreme fiscal issue that this amendment would raise, and I, for obvious reasons, both the spirit of the bill, my intent, and budgetary reasons, this amendment is not workable. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Discussing AM1220 offered by Senator Schimek. Any senators wishing to speak? Senator Schimek, I do not see any lights on. Did you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I haven't had time to really look at this fiscal note so it's a little bit hard to respond to it, but I don't think there's any question that education can help prevent accidents, and so my question would be, do we spend money up front or do we spend money after the accident has occurred? Let me ask...let me ask Senator Smith a question or two about this fiscal note.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Smith, could you kind of capsulize for us what this particular fiscal note says? We would need, what, about a half a million dollars to cover registration and...well, just tell me what this is saying to us.

SENATOR SMITH: Well, if you start in kind of the upper left-hand corner,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.
