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One thing that I want to pursue, and that is the federal involvement with this. It's inevitable that we have to deal with the federal government on this, and one thing that I do not want to be an issue here is the fact that let's do nothing because the federal government is looking at it. That was an argument against this bill four years ago, or against this issue four years ago, and the federal government still has not enacted anything. Now, they're supposed to, but they have various agencies performing various tasks and contracting with this company and that company, and we might get something. But the fact is, that may not be enough to legitimately tell our constituents that, hey, we've granted you the right to subscribe to a no-call list so that you will not be bothered by commercial entities begging for money or selling you a product that you can't see. But I believe that we can come up with something that is workable and utilize the legislative process here to adopt good, sound policy. I want to thank Senator Cudaback for prioritizing this bill and I grant him the remainder of my time for him to give some remarks. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Cudaback, would you like to use the rest of the time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, I will use some of it. Madam President and members and Senator Smith, I guess we all look for areas and we have one bill that we can prioritize. We want to make that a special thing to do. We want one that's going to affect people in a good way. I've always kind of introduced bills that cost the state dollars, counties dollars, whomever, and try to save dollars here and there, but this year, as a budget year, it's rather difficult to introduce any bills that spend dollars. And Senator Smith had this bill out there and I said, hey, I think this is one for me. And he explained it to me and I said, let's go for it. So I'm glad Senator Smith brought this. I mean what other bill would do as much for people? And everybody here understands this. I don't need to stand up here and Senator Smith doesn't need to stand up here. We've all been confronted or whatever with the situation that this bill deals with, so we don't have to explain it. It's self-explanatory. I mean, if you have a mother, if you have a father, you if have a sister or brother, friends, wife, we've all been, you know...and I want to
