something will be done if we come to those...that agreement. And I guess with that, if Senator Smith wants some of my time here, I'm learning here as well, so this is an issue that it's just...it's of importance, I think. So, Senator Smith, if you care to use the rest of my time, that's fine.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Smith, would you care to have the time, three minutes and 50 seconds?

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. And briefly, I want to emphasize the fact that we're not going to work out all of these issues on General File, and it is important that we move in a direction and be able to end up with something useful. And you have a handout, I believe, from Senator Stuhr that mentions the federal action, and basically Congress assigned to the FTC, Federal Trade Commission, the authority to create a do-not-call list, so they've done that. The thing is, they don't have the jurisdiction over a lot of the subject entities, and that's why the FCC, the Federal Communications Commission, is looking at doing the same thing. The FCC is not as far along as the FTC. (Laugh) Apologize for all these acronyms. I've been having problems aligning the two myself. But the fact is we, as the state of Nebraska, have the opportunity to accomplish a lot by recognizing what the feds have done and are doing, and at the same time establishing something useful for Nebraska. And as I said, I want and am drafting amendments to reflect this, to basically take Nebraska and refer to a federal list so that, as Senator Bourne I think alluded to, we're not recreating the wheel, we're not creating a new bureaucracy or forcing anything on the Public Service Commission that they did not want. There have been very favorable comments from the Public Service Commission in terms of our efforts. They're interested. They get bombarded with complaints. Let's allow them the authority to do something about it, because if we do nothing, I believe that we are doing more to impair the Public Service Commission than otherwise. So again, thank you.
