SENATOR FRIEND: So this bill, this bill, in its current form, would never stop that type of behavior. I mean, even if you're on that...

SENATOR SMITH: No, but...

SENATOR FRIEND: ...even if you're on that do-not-call list, somebody that is geared to creating that type of fraudulent behavior is going to find you and they're going to call you anyway, correct?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, but if someone with the power of attorney for an elderly person wanted to subscribe them to the list so that they're not even tempted...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR SMITH: ...to donate to a potentially fraudulent organization, they could do that. Without this bill, without any action right now, we can do nothing. That power of attorney for an elderly person who's vulnerable can do nothing.

SENATOR FRIEND: Okay, I...I see your point. I mean that answers a good specific question. I mean, I don't think I asked the question very specifically, but you answered the question. Do you think, in your opinion, and I'll just ask you this last question, in your opinion, do you think technology in a lot of ways can alleviate some of the problems that we're dealing with right now in this arena, the expansion of technology, the things that are happening out there? I mean, do you think it's something that...I guess that's my contention. I was wondering what you thought about that just based on some of the things you've heard and the research you've done.

SENATOR SMITH: If we don't allow citizens of Nebraska to...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you.
