actually, which you should think of in conjunction with the penalty section, because it gives them a defense which I think goes a long ways to protecting them against some inadvertent violation. It says, "It shall be a defense in any action or proceeding brought under Section 8," the penalty provision, "that the person or entity has established and implemented, with due care, reasonable practices and procedures to effectively prevent telephone solicitations in violation of the Telephone Solicitation Regulation Act." So I think, as between the penalty provisions and that defense, and hopefully with good judgment on the part of the Public Service Commission, which by and large I think they've always exercised, this will all work out very nicely. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the closing. All in favor of the amendment please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.
