1992, they expected the Legislature to work to have an effective and prosperous state lottery, which they have. Increasing the prizes to the players of the games ensures the continued success of our state lottery and treats the customers more fairly. Just so you know, there were a number of people who testified on behalf of the bill. They included the Nebraska Lottery, as well as recipients of the grant money such as First (sic) Fiber and Nebraska State Recycling, Pheasants Forever, the Nebraska State Education Associates (sic). There were no testifiers in opposition to the bill. With that, that is my opening remarks, Mr. Speaker, and if anyone has any questions I would certainly try to answer them. Thank you.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Committee amendments.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The committee amendments is very simple and it changes the sunset provision of the bill from October 1, 2008, to January 1 of 2008. This change was approved by the committee with a goal of providing for a review of the success of these changes in a timely manner. It simply changes...it's a simple change that will essentially allow for discussion of the issue during the 2007 Session, rather than waiting to the 2008 Session. It's a simple amendment and I believe it would give us a little more leeway to judge what's happening in the future rather than waiting till 2008. Thank you.
