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SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if that were to be the source, what would you say about that?

SENATOR SCHROCK: The Education Fund?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR SCHROCK: It's all money, but I'm okay with that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I'm okay with that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And as far as what you said about the source, I'm not concerned about the source. I just want to be sure that the money can come from someplace, and if that is feasible, what I just mentioned, I have no objection to that.

SENATOR SCHROCK: I would be glad to work with you on this. I'm just not sure the Environmental Trust has the funds, and I'm not sure of the appropriateness. Now no one will argue with you, I don't believe, on money needed for this program. That's not my quarrel here. I hope you understand that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, you made that very clear and, as I said, Senator Beutler may have an alternative and we'll wait and see.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Give the rest of my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Brown, on the Chambers amendment, AM1255.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President and members, I will support this amendment and I believe that if this is not the most significant environmental issue that we have in the eastern part of the
