SENATOR CHAMBERS: Had you talked to the organization of black police officers...

SENATOR MOSSEY: No, I had not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...about this bill?

SENATOR MOSSEY: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you talked to only white police officers. Is that true?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Correct. The majority of which work throughout the whole city of Omaha.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, the majority of the police officers are white, no question. But you didn't talk to the Latino officers, nor did you talk to the black officers. Did you attempt to contact those two groups?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Well, let me...I didn't contact those two groups. I talked to the president of the Omaha Police Union and other members of Omaha Police Union. But those other two organizations have probably about 40-45 members combined.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the Omaha Police Union does not represent all of the white officers even, does it?

SENATOR MOSSEY: I can get an official number for you on how many members are in the Omaha Police Union, if you like.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But here's what you do know, because you were there. When you were there, did the Omaha Police Union represent all...were all of the white police officers in the police union when you were on the force?

SENATOR MOSSEY: If I had to give a percentage, I'd say it's very close...
